

## Comment directly onto a preprint with Hypothes.is

Allows you to add in-line comments directly onto a preprint

1. Sign up for an account
2. Install the bookmarklet or extension
3. Navigate to the preprint and open the extension
4. Highlight the text you wish to comment on
5. Add a final summary once you've finished commenting

## Write and upload a more traditional review

Publicly share complete, traditional looking, reviews

1. Sign up for ORCID and PRereview accounts
2. Select your preprint of choice and enter the DOI
3. Write your review or follow the steps provided
4. Add any review co-authors and submit the review

## Leave a comment on a preprint

Leave a short or long review directly next to a preprint

1. Check that the preprint server has a commenting function
2. Navigate to the preprint
3. Select the comment tab or scroll to the bottom of the preprint to the commenting section
4. Leave your comment

Note: Many preprint servers do not have direct commenting functions, making the other options here more appropriate

- + *Comments appear next to the preprint*
- + *Can be a quick method of leaving a long or short review*

## Review as part of a preprint club

Use any of the approaches above as part of a preprint club

Posting public reviews from a journal club benefits authors and journal club members

This reduces wasted time and effort of normal journal clubs

Take notes during the review discussion and upload via PRereview or comment in real-time with hypothes.is
